<u>Course Description:</u> The goal of this course is to acquaint you with the major theories of counseling and psychotherapy, including some modern approaches. I will present a series of lectures providing an overview of these theories, methods, and research in the practice of counseling and psychotherapy. I will also show several videotapes of counseling sessions (part of an APA series) as examples of various theoretical orientations. This course is not meant to be all-inclusive or to make any one of you able to practice as a counselor or therapist. Rather, it is meant to introduce you to a variety of basic theories and techniques. Class will include lectures and in-class exercises, such as role-play.
